KEVIN D. COX Chief Counsel

Mr. Cox was selected as the Chief Counsel in January 2014. In his role as Chief Counsel, he is responsible for providing legal and business advice to the Commander, Deputy to the Commander and all senior management officials on all issues affecting Sierra Army Depot operations.

Prior to reporting to Sierra, Mr. Cox was a Contracts attorney with RDECOM working with the Edgewood Chemical & Biological Center and the US Army Chemical Materials Agency. Previous that to that posting, Mr. Cox was the Chief of Procurement and Environmental Law at the 65th Air Base Wing, Azores, Portugal from 2009-2012.



Mr. Cox started his professional career on active duty as a member of the US Army Judge Advocate General's Corps from 1990-1993 where he was assigned to the US Army Trial Defense Service. He received numerous awards and decorations for his courtroom performance and was invited to teach criminal and constitutional law at the Hawaii Pacific University (1992-1993). Mr. Cox also deployed in 1991 to the Middle East as a Special Staff Officer with Task Force 4-87. The battalion received the Superior Unit Award upon their return to the US. Mr. Cox has also served as an Attorney-Advisor with the US Navy and the USMC.

Mr. Cox resigned from federal service in 2001 to start a 501 (c-3) non-profit corporation dedicated to exposing pedophiles and assisting victims in their search for psychological and legal closure. The Missing Angels Legal Fund, Inc. was instrumental in the break-up of three dangerous pedophile rings operating in Michigan as well as assisting in the class actions lawsuits against a number of religious and non-religious officials and organizations. His book, *Walking In Your Footsteps*, was featured in many news and press releases and his numerous appearances on TV and radio in 2001 helped spark the nationwide movement of victims of child sexual abuse to break their silence and expose those who prey upon children.

Mr. Cox was born in Detroit and attended the Wayne State University and the Michigan State University College of Law (1985, 1989 respectively). He also obtained his LL.M. in International & Comparative law from the National Law Center, The George Washington University, Washington DC while a member of the A-12 Trial Team (1998). Mr. Cox is a member of the American Legion and the 25th Infantry Division.
